Joe Giulietti as Commissioner of the Connecticut Department of Transportation (DOT) was one of Governor Ned Lamont's first cabinet appointments. Giulietti recently served as the President of the MTA Metro-North Railroad, where he was hired to restore safety and confidence in the railroad system.

Joseph Giulietti has devoted his career to public transportation, starting as a brakeman and assistant conductor at Penn Central Railroad, rising through the ranks until he became president of the MTA Metro-North Railroad, the nation's second largest commuter railroad. Prior to leading the Metro-North Railroad, Giulietti worked for 15 years at the South Florida Regional Transportation Authority, where he served first as Deputy Executive Director and then as its Executive Director. Along the way, he ran railroads and waterborne services, and contracted bus operations; launched industry-leading and award-winning safety initiatives; and testified before Congress on contracted operations and rising liability insurance costs.
